





Each year in February, my track mates and I begin to get a little itchy. By that time, we've been off the track for a few months and our hearts are filled with an odd combination of excitement, worry, and anticipation. As a result, we race to the computer and sign-up for our first track event of the season. As fate (or logic in this case) would have it. our first few events are usually run in the bitter cold. the snow, or the rain. Let me tell you, Barber Motorsports Park is an incredible facility and one of the nations most exciting tracks, but a race weekend there in the snow is not much fun. Again this year, my first competitive event was scheduled for a cold and snowy weekend, and likely the next two or three will be the same.

In the end, whether you are a professional racer, an amateur track star, or a DE junkie, sooner or later (usually sooner) you will be faced with driving in adverse conditions. More often than not, that means rain. Oh yes, on TV rain is exciting and ensures that almost any result is possible, but when we face it ourselves, oftentimes it elicits fear, anxiety, or the depression associated with a "wasted" weekend. At most Driver Education events, car counts drop significantly when the rain begins to fall. Drivers start thinking about heading home early, or going to other nearby activities to help pass the time. At DE events, I too will generally pack up the gear and pray for clearer skies later in the weekend.

However, we all know that guy. The one fellow that when the rain falls just keeps turning laps, and does so with a big smile on his face. Running in the rain can be a real hoot if you keep your head about you, apply some wet weather driving knowledge, and adopt a more whimsical frame of mind. Additionally, the skills required to effectively manage rain will make you a better dry-weather driver, and help your everyday driving safety as well. Some of my most memorable track events and dearest driving sessions were run in wet stormy conditions. Let's discuss the dynamics of driving in the wet.

First of all, wet track driving usually suggests using capable wet weather rain tires. For a DE event, good wet-weather street tires will work just fine (in fact quite well). At a PCA DE event, I will switch from my racing slicks to my daily street tires for wet weather conditions. Racing wets are really unnecessary unless you are in true racing conditions. If so, slap on a set of Hoosier wet race tires and enjoy a significant level of wet weather grip. Dry weather track tires, DOT track tires, and racing slicks are incredibly BAD in the wet. If they are cold, you can barely get up your driveway. The

one exception to this, is a set of hot racing slicks. While I would never suggest driving on slicks in the wet, occasionally (especially if racing in variable conditions) a driver will have the need to push his tires through a couple extra laps as the rain begins to fall. Fully warm slick race tires in the hands of a skilled driver do a particularly good job in light rain. I rode along with an old friend of mine in the warm-up session for a VLN race on the Nurburgring (in a nice GT3 Cup car as well). After a lap or two, it began to rain reasonably hard. We ran another 10 minutes or so on the warm slicks, and I was amazed at the speeds we could hold until the rain began to cool the tires (don't try this at home).

From an equipment standpoint, tires are all you need. You must also adapt a wet driving frame of mind. This can be quite difficult if you've spent the last couple of days pushing hard in the dry for that extra 10th of a second. In the wet, you will immediately begin running as long as 2x the lap times that you ran in the dry. Accept that fact and move on. In all but the highest horsepower cars, you will likely manage the straights under full power. These acceleration zones require slower hands than in the dry, and even more focus on smooth deliberate driving technique. Your tires carry significantly less traction per degree of slip angle than your dry weather tires. Also, be sure to be cautious. Some new track drivers, used to driving in the wet at highway speeds on capable tires will not be expecting how slick driving at the edge in the wet can be. Additionally, your mind will naturally want to focus in on the task at hand, but in reality you need to open your awareness and track vision. If you are at a DE, cars will be sliding across the track in ways and in places you've never imagined before.

I equate wet track driving to driving in the snow on the street. You don't want to be the white-knuckled worried self that locks up every time the car begins to slide. You do want to be the frolicking openminded and light-handed guy that's doing donuts in the parking lot.

So far, we've covered equipment and mindset for wet driving. Next month we'll talk technical about braking and proper line selection in the wet. Until then, sign up for a nearby DE event, and enjoy your Porsche vehicle to its fullest!



Most of my Porsche friends know that I spent the last 6 months of 2015 searching for a dedicated track car. And that I came very close to making a deal a few times and missed one opportunity by only 4 hours. Well, I finally found *The One*, a 2006 Cayman S purpose-built for the track by a notable Cayman racing team. 


This year I added a few new tracks to my 2016 schedule including Mid Ohio, VIR and Watkins Glen. My plan for the beginning of the season was simple-to get seat time in the new car at 2 tracks I am very familiar with- NCM & Putnam Park- before a 2 day event at Mid Ohio in May.

The first day at NCM was sunny, cool and awesome! The car handled like it was on rails and I quickly shattered by personal best lap time in the GT3 by a few seconds. An impressive accomplishment considering progress in this sport is measured in 10ths of seconds.

This was my first time participating in a NASA event. NASA runs 4 categories of HPDE from Beginner to Advanced with different rules of engagement for each run group. Drivers start in Group 1, request a check ride to display learned skills and are promoted through the ranks. Because

I had no prior experience with this organization and a new car I conservatively signed up for Group 3.



After each track session there is a required classroom session referred to as a 'Download' to discuss safety, track conditions and rule violations. Drivers are literally called out by car number in front of the group and asked about off track excursions, aggressive driving, etc. At the last download of the day, the Chief

Instructor asked "who is driving the silver Cayman?" My first though was "Uh-oh, I must have done something wrong." I reluctantly raised my hand. He leaned back in his chair, tucked in his chin while giving a few nods and said "very impressive-would you like to come play with us in Group 4 tomorrow?" "You bet" I calmly replied (while on the inside I was giving myself a high-five). My friend David from Indianapolis who tracks with me looked over from his seat and gave me a wink of acknowledgement.

Day 2 was cold, rainy and while many cars stayed in the paddock I used the time as an opportunity to work on my car control skills. It made for an intense and exciting day. I was witness to numerous slide offs and spin outs including a very close call with a new GT4 who got sideways and crossed my path twice in the brake zone at the end of the middle straightaway!
