

NEW EXPERIENCE @ PCNA by Jamie Donaldson

It began a year ago. I was attending a convention in Atlanta, and decided this would present an opportunity to tour the newly opened Porsche Experience Center. I extended my stay for an extra night at a downtown hotel, losing the discounted convention pricing for a Sunday night stay. So Monday morning I checked out and drove south to visit this new mecca of Porsche Cars North America. The official brochure I have consulted states it includes the national business offices, "a Human Performance Center, on and off road driving courses, Personalization and Customization Lounge, the Porsche Classic Restoration Center, and superb cafe and renouned restaurant." I wasn't sure what some of those operations offered, but the brochure certainly made them sound important, and I was going to check them out. My main mission was to see the various Porsches on display and have lunch. As I neared the facility area I discovered it had its own highway exit named One Porsche Drive, making it much easier to find in the tangle of area highways that is typical Atlanta, especially near the Hartsfield Airport. I approached the security gatehouse, and was shocked to be told that I could not enter the grounds because I didn't have an appointment! What, I'm driving a Porsche, why would I need an appointment? I thought my Cayenne should be sufficient ticket to be admitted! Anyway, after several minutes of back and forth with the attendant it was obvious the gate would not be opened for me today, and now I'm pissed! I had changed travel plans, paid for an extra night in a downtown hotel, and was going to turn around and drive 6 hours home in a foul mood! Humbug!

It's now a year later, I will again be in Atlanta on a business trip, and I intend to find out about this PCNA appointment restriction. Through a phone conversation I'm informed that our Homeland Security Agency requires personal identification for everyone accessing the Experience Center grounds due to its location adjacent to the extreme busy Hartsfield Atlanta airport. What! Do they actually believe a scenario like a terrorist entering the PCNA property driving a Porsche, with an anti-aircraft missile in the car? So I make an appointment for lunch in the 356 Restaurant in 2 weeks. Later that day they phone me back to confirm my identity and appointment time, and I'm starting to hear the James Bond







theme music playing in my head!

I'm once again on One Porsche Drive, approaching the security entrance gate with some apprehension left from my last year visit. But this time my appointment is listed on the official clipboard, and after showing my ID the gate lifted and I drove in! Porsche Design principles result in distinctive architecture

in the company buildings, very apparent in my visit to Stuttgart headquarters last year. Here in Atlanta is another recognizable edifice, with top notch facility lay-out and detailed landscaping. I parked and entered to explore the interior offerings, having 2 hours before my lunch appointment in the "renowned 356 Restaurant." One wing of the U shaped building houses the PCNA offices, all visible behind a glass wall. But I was more interested in seeing the car selection, and there were many on display!

And here is the original Boxter, the car that I believe would have evolved had my 914 continued in development from 1976.

Behind the main building is the Driving Experience facility, made up of a Handling Circuit track, Low Friction Circle(wet), Kick Plate(skid pad), and an Off Road track for 4 wheel drive adventures. Many different models of P-cars were available for "driver and performance training." The panoramic view from the patio is excellent for seeing all track activities, and beyond the far end of the track I could easily see planes lifting off 2 of the Hartsfield runways, flights departing at about 20 second intervals. As for Homeland Security concerns, I could have ranged the planes with a lucky 50 caliber hit,



but well out of range for an RPG! I guess we can't be too cautious in these turbulent terrorist times. After watching activities outdoors its about time for lunch in the 356, so I head back indoors. The restaurant is immaculate as expected, menu with diverse offerings, although a bit pricey for my Scottish heritage! I order a salad with beef strips, and the place is filling fast somewhat to my surprise. Waiters were most attentive, meal promptly served and excellent, and I began to gather myself for the journey back home to Kentucky. This means again driving through the center of Atlanta, but at least it won't be the mad traffic at peak hours. I couldn't imagine fighting this gridlock twice each weekday, and am glad to be back in the more open flow of traffic on I 75 as I aim the Cayenne north toward home and set the cruise control. The visit to the Experience Center was good, I kept my appointment, but I couldn't live here and not be able to enjoy driving my Porsche on open highways.
