A very nice day for over 210 vehicles to converge on the parking lot in front of Value City Furniture at Hamburg. Some of the very cool vehicles were: a Citroen 2CV, a Bentley, a very classic Mercedes, a Cord, 57 Chevy Station wagon, and many hot rods. Oh yes, and there were a few nice Porsches there too! Lots and lots of eye candy.

Neil Fisher chaired the Porsche Cars & Coffee on July 9 at Cosi Restaurant. He had 12 members and a guest attend. They brought 9 Porsches and an Abarth. Good food and lots of conversation.

On July 16 we made a major presence at our annual signature event, the Keeneland Concours d'Elegance. All I can say now is Congratulations to the Bluegrass Region. We were outstanding!! Tim McNeely and his bucket brigade blew away the competition in the Paddock Challenge for the ninth time in the 12 years the contest has been held. From a paddock of 110 Porsches, a donation of \$3,119.45 was collected. That far exceeded the next highest Sterling British donation of \$1,015 with 44 cars in their paddock. Porsche won the Paddock Challenge Trophy and Sterling British won the Individual Giving Plaque. The overall winner was the Kentucky Children's Hospital. Fantastic!!

We had a first time event for our National PCA in July. On July 18 the National Board of Directors held their first teleconference call with voting on national issues. Prior votes have been held at either a Summer or Winter Board meetings where region proxies were voted by Zone Representatives. Most of us have participated in teleconference calls, however the scenario becomes more complicated when official voting is included in the call. Our National Board consists of 143 Region Presidents, 11 Standing Committee Chairs, and 5 Executive Council Members. With a voting body of 159, it is difficult to even ensure a quorum. The process used on the July 18 call was excellent. Two key issues that were passed was the purchase and buildout of office space at National Office and the approval of a National PCA Whistle Blower Policy. I see many advantages from use of the teleconference voting and expect to see it used for future votes.



We've been talking for quite some time. If you've been tracking as long as I've been writing this, you're likely getting pretty good. Perhaps you started track driving at a local (or not so local) PCA Driver Education (DE) event? As all folks do, you've endured various driving instructors, countless classroom sessions, and seemingly thousands of drivers' meetings as you progress from that very first event, through the novice and beginner classes, to the magical moment of solo driving, and perhaps into the advanced run groups. Likely your originally stock Porsche vehicle has morphed into an even more track-oriented beast with harnesses, power and suspension upgrades, and maybe even some dabbling with advanced racing aerodynamics.

All of these achievements represent steps along the way to becoming a truly skilled high-performance driver. If you take the time to assess your progress, you will no doubt feel some level of satisfaction with your advanced knowledge, hands-on "go do something" hobby, and the personal relationships driving events have brought into your life. BUT... There's always a "but". You are likely competitive by nature, and that spirit makes you strive for more in spite of past accomplishments. Maybe you are looking for more of a challenge. Perhaps your advanced status seems a bit anti-climatic. Inevitably, strong advancing drivers want more.

For the remainder of this installment, I'll throw out some ideas about what comes next, and ask a few questions for you to ponder that may help you identify the next steps in your racing hobby (forget driving, you're a racer now).

What comes next? There are any number of ways to move, and in the end its on the individual to figure it out. However, as I have these discussions over and over again with my buddies across the racing spectrum, I may be able to add a little food for thought. Let's start with a look at the spectrum of available options. You could become a certified Porsche driving instructor, and help others to learn

the sport you have grown to love. You may choose to become what we affectionately call a "DE King"; an all-out assault on being the very fastest guy at any track event you attend - a DE one-percenter. Perhaps racing is your desire? You could try your hand at regional road racing or time-trials with an organization like NASA or the SCCA. Perhaps a structured club racing series would better suit your desires, like Porsche or BMW club racing. There are many near adjacencies to regional or club racing as well. Series like LeMons or Chump Car provide a low-cost and high-fun equation to enjoy head-tohead racing. You could race karts, open wheel, dirt track, off-road, or specialty car series. If you have the budget, time, and talent, local drivers have broken into series like Trans-Am, Continental Tire Challenge, and NARRA with considerable success. Maybe you just want to become an even better driver, and taking advantage of modern telemetry devices, and/or the use of a talented driver coach could break you through a current threshold.

No matter which direction you choose, spend the time to thoroughly research the rules, equipment, schedule, and costs associated with the potential new endeavor. Some additional items to consider follow. Do you want to or have the ability to have a dedicated track or racecar? A dedicated car requires a hauler, a trailer, and all of the equipment necessary to transport your racecar from event to event. Many degrees of freedom open up in trackcar performance space with a dedicated car. Are you more interested in driving, competing, or working on developing a car? Your interest may guide your choice. Is a track weekend a social event for you? Many race series and driving clubs cater to gentlemen drivers looking for a more social environment. Finally, what is your working budget? Racing is expensive and the realities of budgetary constraints have interrupted more than one driver's plans.

In the end, while it may seem frustrating, charting a new path can be an exciting process that yields great dividends. Don't rush too quickly to decide on

a future driving plan. Be sure to let it season, as you are sure to re-chart and reformulate your plan many times. However, as it solidifies, take the time to go and observe other types of event and talk to the racers. Ultimately, they will always give you the best advice.

# Keeneland Concours d'Elegance

Well we've come a very long way since August of 2004 when the first Lexington Concours d'Elegance was held at the Stone Gatehouse at the Keeneland Race Course. Our Bluegrass members, Tom and Connie Jones have far exceeded our charge for them to chair a little concours at Keeneland. renamed Keeneland Concours d'Elegance has become what is arguably one of the top ten concours in North America. And, it is also our signature annual event. There are many aspects of our concours that are unique to us alone. The Saturday Day of Show, the next day Tour of Excellence, the Sports Car Paddock, and the ambiance of Keeneland. As important, is that we are widely known for our true southern hospitality and friendly nature.

So now let's talk the 2016 Day of Show. We had very good attendance with over 4,500 attendees. Most entered through an actual 12 chute race starting gate. You probably didn't see the gate because you arrived in one of the 468 cars in the Sports Car Paddock. So how about all of the shade and benches available in the paddock? With most concours you sit on a curb in the sun. Also, those 33 volunteers working to get you parked in your paddock, all

but three from our local cars clubs. You see them at our monthly Bluegrass Cars & Coffees. When you parked in the Porsche paddock, you



quickly met Tim McNeely and his bucket brigade. These folks not only participate in the Paddock Challenge; they are "in it to win it"! And for the ninth time out of twelve, they did. The Paddock Challenge was an idea of Becky Cleaver, a past Vice-President of our region and now deceased. Over the twelve years, the challenge has generated a total of \$62,994.18 for donation to the Kentucky Children's Hospital. It is a fun competition and a year of "bragging rights" for the winners of the challenge trophy and plaque.





Some of the changes for this year' concours:

- Use of one large tent for the food vendor area
- Two additional exits from the paddock (still need improvement here)
- Additional benches and more shade
- Entry starting gate changed from a 4 chute to a 12 chute
- Improved PA system for the paddock
- Full time on-site medical coverage with truck, paramedic and EMT
- A cooling area in Entertainment Center with free water

 Keeneland provided water to grandstand spectators during awards ceremony

And as for Porsches, we had vehicles from Ohio, Florida, Illinois, and Montana. We were especially pleased to see an 11 car contingent from our neighboring Kentucky Region, who not only purchased a block of 50 entry tickets but also contributed \$250!!!

We enjoyed the company of James Jacisin, our Zone 13 Representative and his sister Cindy Jacisin. Cindy is our National Secretary. James, Cindy and their significant others drove down from Chicago to attend the show.



The number of PCA members who regularly support the concours through volunteering is large. I want to thank you all for making this event so special for the rest of us.
