Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes:

Minutes of the June 1st and July 6th meetings were reviewed and discussed. Tim made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted, Ed seconded the motion. Approved.



Last weekend we made the journey to participate in a HPDE event with Rezoom Motorsports at Barber Motorsports Park in Birmingham, Alabama. I heard so many good things about the track I had very high expectations. I can tell you it did not disappoint. The grounds are immaculate, staff attentive and the track fantastic.



We arrived early enough Friday to tour the museum and see an incredible and extensive collection of motorcycles going back to the late 1800's and every era since. There were a few Porsches, as well as several F1 and Lotus race cars.



Barber is host to the Porsche Sport Driving School and as you might imagine, there were Porsche's everywhere. There are Panamera S, Boxsters and 911 S in the stable as well as 2 new GT4's that arrived just 2 weeks prior. By coincidence I ran into Bluegrass PCA

member Josh Fanin who just finished the 1 Day Sport Driving School and was lucky enough to drive one of the GT4's!

I spent the weekend with 3 Porschephiles- Mike a local from Birmingham with his 2015 GT3, Allen who was driving a 2013 911 GTS and Curt, from Chattanooga who picked up a 2011 Cayman R race car just two days earlier and was driving it for the first time. Curt is a certified Porsche instructor and has participated in every Porsche Driving School class, shared seat time with Hurley Haywood as his instructor and qualified to drive solo in the Cup Car school. I rode with him for a session in the Cayman--he is an aggressive and skilled driver. Back home in the garage, Curt has a Panamera S, Cayenne S, 997 GT3 AND a 2016 Lava Orange GT3 RS on order. He is my hero...

The elevation changes make this circuit a rollercoaster for grown-ups and a blast to drive. After a couple of sessions I was signed off to run solo and started working on perfecting my line and lap time. I will definitely go back. If you are anywhere in the area I highly recommend you make time to visit and tour the museum.



TRACK TIME

We are about half way through the 2015 racing season. As a Porsche fan, you should be pretty impressed at this point. The Porsche factory prototype team (LMP1 class) was launched last year (2014) with great expectations. Sadly, they fell short of those expectations, and were thoroughly dominated by Audi. This year it's a different story. Not only did Porsche dominate at Le Mans, they continue to excel in the WEC championship series (the world's most advanced sports car racing series), and following the race at the Nurburgring (which they won) Porsche has a solid hold on first place. Additionally, with the release of the new 911 GT3 Cup RSR, Porsche also holds first place in WEC GT racing as well.

Closer to home, Ryan Dalziel is leading the GT class in the Pirelli World Challenge in a Porsche 911, and Porsche is leading in the GTLM class in the IMSA TUDOR United SportsCar Championship. It seems as if you can turn on a sports car race on any given Sunday and have a winning Porsche entry to cheer for. This has been no small feat; there are excellent cars and drivers throughout the sports car racing ranks. The competitive teams from the likes of BMW, Audi, Corvette, Ferrari, and so on have some of their best equipment ever, and coupled with 'Balance Of Performance' BOP rule sets across the racing landscape, it is very difficult to mount a winning effort in a series these days. However, in spite of it all, Porsche has been dominating, and with success breeding success, the drivers seem to be building confidence in their equipment, and accelerating their winning ways.

On a heavier note, the world has lost a number of excellent drivers this year. In comparison to decades past, racing continues to get safer for drivers, crews, and fans alike, but sometimes the odds catch up with us. In all of the tragedies, unexpected freak circumstances led to a chain reaction of events that ultimately took the life of one of our racing superstars. These losses are not limited to the professional ranks; we also lost a

If you follow racing and DE forums, Twitter, or Facebook feeds, you have undoubtedly seen the discussion threads scrutinizing driver safety, instructor safety, proposed racing and DE rules changes, etc. I'll not comment on the specific issues at hand other than to say the tragedies of the past have been directly responsible for the safety of today's high-quality racing series. Our sport has evolved to a place where safety and quality sporting product coexist. Hopefully, the tragedies of today result in safer racing in the future with even more exciting event competitiveness and fan appeal.

My final comments are geared towards the individual attending a racing event and the student driver at Driver Education training events. As a fan, always remember that there is a risk of cars crashing, driving off-course, or shedding seemingly innocent parts that can be fatal to fans or crewmembers. The safety of today's racing environments, coupled with the distraction of our highly connected and smartphone dominated world, create sporting events where dangerous environments are shrugged off as innocent social events with no more risk than watching at home on TV. Please pay attention to what is going on around you should you have the opportunity to attend a pro racing event. The current motorsports world provides perhaps one of the most accessible, and family-friendly sporting events of all. Please consider attending a nearby event. They are fantastic and will certainly leave a lasting impression, but do so with a vigilant eye towards safety, and we will all be better off for the effort.

Within the last 10,000 miles, timing belts, rollers, and water pump were replace. New TK26 (OEM) turbo-charger. All the coolant hoses, replaced. Everything works including the AC blows cold, might need charged, but I would do that.

Rear Tires

It idles rough, I am sure there is a vacuum leak in the hoses. I have all the gaskets and hoses to do the job just haven't done it.
