Neil Fisher will be our newsletter editor. Please help me welcome him and contribute with content for the Rumble. Neil's first issue will be January 2013.







Ballots will be mailed December 1st and are to be returned by December 15th. Results will be announced at the January 13th Winter Party.





After snapping photos, we, of course, had to road test, being the serious car people we are. We ran over one of my test loops, which always leaves plenty of organic material on the paint (above right). At one point on a straight stretch with no one behind us, Gary stopped, pressed the "Sport Plus" button and floored the throttle. Acceleration was hard enough that this old man struggled to keep his head upright off the headrest to see the earth rushing past us. This was a moving experience. My cars are so old!

This is my third SC since 1986, and the '71 T, '76 S, and '85 Carrera owned previously also were entertaining, but I am enjoying this car

more than I did the others.

and I rebuilt the 3.0 engine

It's been about 10 months since my last report on the '79 SC project, so here's the latest. Jim Brandon, Ben Prewitt, from the crank up with 9.3 compression Mahle pistons and cylinders in place of the old 8.5 compression Alusil set.

Mike Fraley in Mt. Sterling (859-498-3440) rebuilt the

heads.

Stock SC cams and a Barry Hershon distributor rebuild/recurve with mechanical advance work well with the 40mm PMO carbs, which following a few

spits on cold start otherwise deliver the driveability of fuel injection. The engine with PMO induction, re-curved distributor and backdated exhaust, sounds wonderful and provides significantly better performance Pole Position were available, I than a stock 3.0 or early 3.2.

With over 1,200 miles now on the engine, I am finally free to run past 5,000 rpm and with full throttle. The SC sounds faster than it is, of course, but handling is surprisingly good at a spirited back road pace.

Much remains to be sorted, but the car has been reliable and fun during the break-in miles.

The 915 is shifting well now with new OEM sport engine and transaxle mounts, new cable, coupler and bushings. The old clutch looked good, but I replaced the friction disc, pilot and throw-out bearings.

The interior with RS carpet and door panels awaits new seats, sun visors and belts. I look forward to retiring the

Unfinished interior awaits black sport seats, but the original touring seats are ...better than milk crates...

original seats, preferably to be replaced by OEM sport seats, but likely new seats with adjustable backs that will allow use of 3-point belts.

If the ABE version of the would go with that fixed-back seat. I am considering rebuilt Recaro LS or LX seats or new

Recaro Speed seats or possibly Corbeau GTS II seats which appear to be influenced by the Recaro LS, or my first choice, new GTS Classics Monte Carlo seats, an interpretation of Recaro seats of the late '70's, which can be ordered with corduroy inserts. I'm saving money.

Fuchs wheel center color now is traditional black, rather than Bilstein (John Deere) Green, but I may try red petals to coordinate with red door straps and red seatbelts.

I may add a ducktail, but the current stock engine lid—which is supremely light, by the way— affords stability up to 100 mph. Call me old and slow, but I don't spend much time above 90 mph on public roads.

Much remains to be done through the winter, such as tweaking the headlight switch internal contact arm to avoid spending \$120 on a new switch.

The SC is no replacement for my '96 4S, at least not without air conditioning, but it delivers a strikingly different and appealing level of performance, a simple yet refined sports car experience unlike any from other manufacturers.

This car likely will never be finished, and that's fine with me and the understanding I had going in. I do not say, however, that working on the car is as much fun as driving.
