





Porsche 915 Transaxle

Taking a closer look



Tech session: We see the most engaging science project and disassemble a 915

Tech Chairman Jim Brandon on December 8th hosted a session at his garage outside Georgetown attended by 16 people to provide an overview of the design of the 915 transaxle and a hot run on the test stand of the 2.7 engine that was the subject of earlier tech sessions.

First, Jim fired the 2.7 which settled into a quiet whir at fast idle. Mounted on a test stand fabricated by Jim, the engine seemed both familiar and new in that we usually do not watch a flat six run up in the air totally exposed. With fuel and electrical lines labeled for clarity, the engine appeared to be the most engaging science project Porsche junkies could imagine. The engine appears to be ready to go, but it may become an ongoing garage project as Jim contemplates mounting a set of Weber carburetors.

Jim then directed everyone's attention to the recentlyacquired 915 transaxle. Having studied the earlier 901 unit last

winter, we now had opportunity to see how the two transmissions vary in design. Jim explained, "As with the 901, the unit is constant mesh, meaning that all gears are engaged at all times. What actually moves when we shift is a sliding collar with the dog teeth which engages mating dog teeth on the selected gear and directs power from the input shaft to the pinion shaft (or vise-versa). The sliding collar contacts the synchronizer ring first (to match rotation with the selected gear) and then 'pops' over the synchronizer to keep the gear engaged."

As with the 901, any grinding one might hear when using a 901 or 915 actually is the dog teeth, not the gears, a bad thing, by the way. Worn dog teeth and synchronizers contribute to difficult shifting and popping out of gear, indicators that it's time to spend cubic dollars for a rebuild.

The 915 shift pattern is different from that of the 901, and the unit is more robust, capable of handling more power than the 901. The actual overall length of the two transaxles is the same, and a 915 can replace a 901 as has been done in Henry Burt's 911. We watched as Jim and assistant Larry Woods disassembled the unit. Jim explained how everything works, so when we must spend cubic

dollars, we have a better idea where the money is going. As usual, the informal session allowed for Q&A, lots of offtopic conversation, humor, donuts, coffee, and, of course, a better understanding of the mechanical side of our favorite sports car, along with time to get to know one another a little better offering, in other words, a perfect Saturday morning. If you have never attended a tech session, you should make a point of being at the next session, regardless of the topic.
