


We also attended the Rallye Por-

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
# TRACK TIME

It has been a busy month. September 13-15 was the Kentucky Region PCA's driver's education event "Fall Fastival". This event was at Putnam Park, a small road course just outside Indianapolis, IN. As described in the past, the Kentucky region events are very well-run, and perhaps the best events in the country for introducing new drivers to the sport of high performance driving. As usual, the event was soldout, and was sponsored by Blue Grass Motorsport. Since our return, I have had dozens of communications (email, texts, calls...) with my current and former students. We share many topics including better driving lines, potential car upgrades, and opportunities to meet up at future events. Track driving is mostly an individual sport, one man and his machine against all others, but the most gratifying elements of this sport are the quality relationships I've developed over the years with an incredibly diverse and unique set of individuals. There are always a large handful of folks I look forward to seeing at each track we visit. I am grateful to all the people that have supported me along the way, and appreciate helping the up-andcomers that look to us for advice and direction. Last month we talked about the wonder of modern tires and their ability to translate contact patch adhesion into the acceleration, deceleration, and lateral road-holding forces we feel in the car. As a driver pushing a vehicle to its limits, one must have a welldeveloped innate sense of g-forces and tire load to balance the vehicle in such a way as to extract the maximum performance possible (as realized in low lap times) without going past the limit and out-ofcontrol. My discussions with new drivers oftentimes center around tires. We have endless talks about optimal tire pressures and the value of moving to a higher performance track tire. So to supplement last month's tire technology discussion, I'd like to stick with the tire theme and cover more ground regarding tire technology and how they work for us on the track. Tires (and vehicles) do not generally approach their limit of performance and then fall off a cliff to the point of no control. Thank goodness! If they responded that way, we could never reach our maximum potential without wrecking a dozen times a weekend. Maybe you remember, as I do, riding a pedal vehicle as a child with plastic tires. You pedal faster and faster

turning all over the place until all of a sudden – you crossed the threshold - and turning the steering wheel doesn't turn the pedal car and it continues in a straight line out of control. Hard plastic tires are neither compliant nor elastic as the rubber and polymer tires of today, so their limit of control is like an on/off switch. One moment you are happily in control, then push a little harder and bang, you are out of control. Compliant elastic tires have a different response that allows us to search for their optimal performance point without fully losing control.

To understand their performance properties we will introduce the concept of "Slip Angle". Imagine a car driving in a circle. The front wheel is turned and the contact patch of the tire is providing grip that drives the car to move laterally. At slow rates of speed, the angle of the steering wheel applies a given amount of pivot to the front wheels, and the line parallel to the angle of the front tires generally determines our direction of travel. Now apply more throttle, and what happens? Keeping the same amount of steering input, but more throttle causes the radius of our circular path to increase. Now the angle of the tires is different than the actual angle of deflection of the car. This difference between the centerline of the tire and the actual direction of travel is called the *slip angle*.






# TRACK TIME

A given slip angle results in a maximum amount of possible traction. We can plot a fictional curve that relates the slip angle of a tire to the maximum amount of traction that it can provide.



This is an interesting diagram. It tells us a number of things. First, over general operating conditions, the greater amount of slip angle, the more traction that exists. Tires like to slip and be driven hard. Slip angle increases heat and friction in the tire, and they provide better performance the harder we push them. Back to the child's pedal-car example; as an actual car pushes harder into a turn it doesn't just lose traction as plastic or metal tires would, it actually grabs harder. Second, there is a maximum amount of traction that a tire produces. The fastest drivers can sense this point best, and drive their cars at slip angles that provide the maximum traction. Third, if you push your car beyond the point of maximum traction, it does not just lose traction abruptly, traction trails off. This allows us time to recover the car if we push it too hard. Finally, it is interesting to note that a driver that doesn't push his car hard enough and operates below his maximum traction point can have the same results as a an experienced driver that pushes too hard and

exceeds the maximum traction point. Many drivers (myself definitely included) learn to push harder and harder to get results, but eventually we have diminishing returns to this approach and begin to run slower lap times. The answer for overdriving is to simply back off a bit and return to the tire's maximum traction point. This curve changes with different tires, and a good driver must learn to sense this curve and extract the most out of the vehicle as its presented to him on a given day, under a given set of operating conditions. These conditions are ever changing and require an understanding of their physics to develop a feel for your car and consistently drive it at the limit. Hopefully, this brief discussion will shed a little light on how modern tires work to produce traction near the limit of performance. Think of this any time you drive. Even at road speeds when you turn the wheel, you can begin to feel the tire scrub against the pavement and create a slip angle. The more aggressively you turn, a greater slip angle develops, and traction increases.


