# **RECENT BGR ACTIVITIES**

### Brake System Tech & the Bluegrass Region's First Birthday Party – Wes Collins

For those of you who missed our Region's **Birthday Party & Tech Session**, held on February 21st at Greg Schickel's home in Georgetown you missed a great time! The day started with a Tech Session in Greg's huge, heated garage, flushing the brake system on my 1987 924S. Greg did a wonderful job of explaining how to correctly flush Porsche brake systems and the three ways of doing it. The system that day put pressure on the entire brake system and the lines, via a low-pressure air tank attached to the brake master cylinder in the engine compartment. We then went to the brake bleeder valve on the caliper on each of the four wheels, opened the breeder value and let the old fluid flow out. We did this until the new fluid (which we had placed into the master cylinder) completely replaced the old in the system. I used new, blue brake fluid, so the new fluid was easier to see when it finally flowed out the bleeder value at each wheel. After we flushed the entire system in my car, we did it a second time to insure all the air was out and that we had placed fresh fluid in the entire system.

After the Tech Session finished, the group went inside Greg's home and enjoyed all the wonderful food brought by the attendees. Brian Kiser, Bluegrass Region President, brought his new baby, who promptly charmed the women present. Be sure to join us for more tech sessions later this year!! # UPCOMING BGR PCA ACTIVITIES:

## "Concours in the Bluegrass at Keeneland," August 28th, 2004- Update by Ken Hold

Work continues on the Concours. The Central Kentucky SCCA will loan us their Track Trailer for use as the event headquarters at Keeneland. Betty Wegner and Becke Cleaver have been exploring several options for event vendors. Phillip Doty has narrowed options around judging and awards. Ken Hold met with Keeneland to resolve many site related questions.

Lee Wegner has been contacting several members of local car clubs. He held a meeting on February 15 to review Concours information with various car club contacts. Fifteen people attended the meeting, representing six car clubs. Input from this meeting will be discussed at the Concours Core Team Meeting on February 29th at Becke Cleaver's home.

Detailed Concours information has been sent to contacts at the surrounding ten PCA Regions so that they can begin planning for our event. National PCA is working with us to get the \$350 national PCA charity subsidy to help with event expenses.

Our biggest immediate challenge remains in locating participant cars and getting sponsors.

The location will be in the grassy area around the Stone Gatehouse, near the main entrance to Keeneland on Versailles Road. This will be a charity event, with the proceeds going to the **University of Kentucky Children's Hospital**.

We intend to exhibit a wide variety of sports cars, with emphasis on those that are unique and rare. Cars will be arranged by **country of origin**, and **by year**, from the earliest to the latest, to illustrate the *"Evolution of the Sports Car,"* in each country. # Notes from PCA National - Phillip Doty

While attending the PCA National Board of Directors Meeting in Savannah, I was able to listen to a presentation by Peter Schwartzenabauer, President of Porsche Cars North America, Porsche's importer for the US and Canada, based in Atlanta. Schwartzenbauer started off by saying how happy he was with Porsche's sales figures: In calendar year 2003, the factory had sold over 30,028 units, compared with their best year ever in 1986 when they sold slightly more at 30,400. He was happy with the Cayenne figures also: It sold over 15,000 units, when it had been targeted at only 12,500 units. Porsche dealers are very happy, according to him, with the new Cayenne owners, who are bringing more referral sales back into their dealerships than even the Boxster or Carrera owners were doing! Schwartzenbauer indicated that PCNA is beginning a consolidated training program, known as "Porsche Academy," and he hinted that access may be given to PCA members. The focus is to better educate the Porsche owner as to the car's heritage and engineering advantages, although he provided no further details.

Schwartzenbauer was understandably mum when it came to answering our questions about the rumored fourth line of Porsche, a reported four door model that would/could challenge Mercedes. He deflected comments saying that the newest line would be a new "sportscar," and said that the number of doors does not define the term, "sportscar."

Regarding the Cayenne, Schwartzenbauer indicated that the new V-6 edition was selling very well, representing 40% of all Cayennes sold, with its base price of \$42,500. When asked the usual question of when the factory would return to motorsports racing, particularly LeMans, he was diplomatic, but somewhat direct: Not any time soon. To enter racing at that level requires a

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corporate investment of \$100 million to be in the top 5. He indicated that racing is slowly dwindling as a factor for new car purchasers: 95% do not care if their car company races on an international basis. Going further, he indicated that Porsche will not enter any off-road racing events and would not build an engine for the Indy Racing League series.



# PORSCHE TECH... from the PCA website

**Q:** When replacing the 02 sensor in my '87 911, is it critical to go with original Bosch 3-wire (green, yellow, brown) or will universal Bosch 3-wire (black, white, white) work as well? And if so, is the black wire spliced to green with the two whites going to the yellow and brown?

**A** It is not necessary to use the exact OEM part. You can use the universal three wire setups. You need to make sure that your connections are excellent and moisture-free. In time, if these are put together without any integrity, they will cause a false reading. Yes, the two white wires will be going to the yellow and brown. These are your power wires to the heated portion of the 02 sensor. Orientation is not that important. The yellow is 12 volts and the brown is ground.
