Clutch Tech Session, by Richard Lane

Saturday the 11th of February was a bit snowy but that did not keep 11 hardy club members from driving to Mt. Sterling for the clutch session on my 1978 911SC. Since the last session I have removed the intake and exhaust systems, the heads/cam carriers, the pistons & cylinders and finally the head studs. If you will recall I had one broken Dilavar head stud that brought this about. I have not cracked the crankcase but there have been a lot of hours put in to cleaning parts as they are removed.

The heads are off to Supertec for 3 angle valve seat grinding, new valve seals and resurfacing. I did discover a bit of "pitting" on the exhaust lobe of #6 on the 4,5,6 cam so they are off at John Dougherty getting reground to 964 specs (good for another 20 HP). The rockers are getting redone as well. I have a nice set of SSI exhaust/heat exchangers and a beautiful SS muffler from M&K that are supposed to add another 15-20 HP.

After showing everyone the progres to date we dove right in to removing the flywheel. Those 9 bolts are tough , but not as tough as Larry Woods!

Weilding the 12 point socket on a whopper of a breaker bar he made short work of them. We cleaned the housing area then set out to remove the flywheel seal. This was not easy and was the cause of death of a Craftsman screwdriver/prybar...but it worked. We tapped in the new flywheel seal and cleaned things up. A brand new flywheel was installed with new bolts. We did also install a new pilot bearing in the flywheel. Torquing these 9 bolts to 66 ft-lbs was tedious but with lots of excellent coaching I got them done. We then took the old pressure plate/Throw out bearing apart to ensure that we had the proper orientation of all the washers. This was a bit easier said than done but we succeeded and completed our new assembly. The next challenge was to make sure and not forget the separate starter ring, most especially its orientation on the pressure plate. I do not think any of us will forget that both the flywheel and pressure plate only go on in a specific orientation as the bolt holes are NOT symetrically placed.

While not a terribly difficult job it sure helped having several expert opinions presnt to double check the process. As we all stood around after we completed the assembly we discussed possible future sessions. I think we will be shooting for a session on cam timing in about three weeks. I hope to have the pistons/cylinders reinstalled, my lovely new ARP head studs in place and my heads/cam carriers all done by then. The cam timing is a very critical part of the reassembly process and one that is difficult to understand without actually seeing it in front of you. If incorrectly done there is potential for the top of the pistons to slap the valves, a VERY bad thing!

I certainly appreciate everyones assistance and participation. It seems like everyone is enjoying the process. I suppose that once we get things back together this might almost be considered the Clubs' project car!! February Social Meeting, by Ken Hold
