

Track Action by Gary Hackney



Modern Porsche brakes are great; just read any magazine road test of any Porsche (this may not be true if you have drums, or single-piston front disks). But track use isn't normal use. How often do you brake

hard from 125mph to 40mph on the street, every two minutes for a half hour? And that's ignoring the other 8 or 9 corners that require lesser amounts of braking. Tracks are hard on brakes.

You might use stock pads and fluid for many events without ever having a problem. But premium brake fluid is cheap compared to other car upgrades and I've always liked to use better fluid. The main failure mode is fluid boiling. Liquids are incompressible; that's what gives you that nice solid pedal feel. But once your fluid boils--and cheap fluid can and does boil in the caliper--those bubbles in the brake lines are very compressible. That's when your pedal goes to the floor. Few non-race cars recirculate brake fluid; that means the fluid that was in your caliper pistons during the last lap is still in the calipers on this lap, and it hasn't had much time to cool down.

If you didn't change your fluid--even though the DE tech sheet told you to--it's probably absorbed water; all fluid does over time. Old fluid boils more easily. Next time you look at your brake fluid can, check the difference between the wet and dry boiling points; it's significant. Fresh fluid is "dry" fluid and is much more resistant to boiling in the calipers and lines. I like ATE Blue and ATE Type 200 (same specs, but the different colors makes bleeding easy; just keep bleeding until the old color is gone.)

I also like to use different front brake pads, although I admit I'm not sure it's necessary on a Porsche. I started doing this when I was tracking my Saturn; the stock pads just couldn't take a 25-minute track session without fading. [Brake fade is when it takes more and more pressure to slow the car from lap to lap; very annoying and very dangerous.] Track pads will have a sharper "bite" and much less fade, giving you the confidence to brake later than that guy you're trying to catch. But unless you're changing tires anyway it's a pain to change pads and probably isn't worth the trouble unless you know from previous events that your stock pads aren't up to the task. I use Hawk Blues on the front and usually leave my street pads on the rear, since the fronts do most of the work.

Track pads also cause more rotor wear, despite the "rotor-friendly" marketing words almost all pads use. Over time you will need to replace front rotors more often

Lots of catalogs offer "big brake" kits. I personally don't see the value in these, as I've never had a brake issue with stock calipers, and I drive and brake pretty hard. If you have enough braking power to lock the wheels or activate the ABS on dry pavement, bigger calipers won't help you. The brakes don't stop the car; the tires stop the car. If you install larger calipers, possibly with more pistons, you might even need a master cylinder with a larger piston diameter to provide the additional fluid needed. And if the bigger brakes require bigger rotors, you've just increased your unsprung rotating mass, which might even make your car slower.

It's the closest large town and within 15 minutes of the track. Friday started with a drivers meeting, hookup with instructors, and track training for each driving class. The track has two major straight-aways and speeds of 100 to 130 mph are common. The section of Climbing Esses is very rhythmic and you sort of feel like you are dancing on four wheels. There are several sweeping turns and five very tight turns, with Oak Tree being the most extreme.

We had mostly good weather. Two exceptions were fog on Saturday morning and rain in the afternoon. The fog cost a 50 minute start delay. As the track is located close to a river it is subject to fog. Track officials are much attuned to safety and no driving was permitted until there was clear visibility. I was initially concerned about driving in the rain, but found it to be a lot of fun and great learning with regards to how my car handles in rainy conditions.

The DE proved to be a good opportunity to test changes we've made to our cars. Benson was very pleased with the major suspension change and wheel/tire changes to his 930. I noticed a positive improvement from the minor suspension change made to my 930S.

We definitely improved our driving skills. Dale was promoted a class. Benson got signed off to solo. Gary continued to hone his top class skills and I was able to find my way around the track.

It was a great time. We met neat folks from several other regions. We learned a lot about the track, fast driving and control. We learned more about what fabulous cars we own. You've got to do a DE! -Ken Hold
