


### Bluegrass Region Holiday Party, December 10th

# **Track Action** by Gary Hackney

I attended the 9th (my 5th) Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta in September. This is the highlight of the American Le Mans Series season: ten hours or 1000 miles, whichever comes first. Four classes of cars on the track at the same time. The Porsche RS Spyders compete in the P2 class and the 911 GT3 RSRs are in GT2.

I'm an SCCA corner worker. The SCCA provides corner workers for every pro road racing event in the US--ALMS, IRL, Grand Am, Champ Car, and even F1. We get in free, work long hours, and have the best seat (although we don't get to sit) in the house. We use flags to keep the drivers informed about track conditions and overtaking cars, and relay instructions from race control. We inform race control about accidents, leaking cars, or the location of the safety car during full-course yellows. Sometimes we get cars out of gravel traps or assist driv-

ers, although most pro events have dedicated safety teams that handle response situations.

This year I worked Turn 1 on Wednesday. I was at Turn 11 the other three days, at the bridge looking down the hill toward Turn 12 and the start/finish. We could see the cars braking hard at the

end of the long backstraight coming into Turn 10A, and blast down the hill through Turn 12 at speeds that would terrify a mere mortal.

As I was an official with "Track" access I could take pictures in the hot pits while the cars were making their final preparations. One of the percs of being stationed at a turn near the pit straight.

In addition to ALMS, the weekend also featured Star Mazda, World Challenge GT, World Challenge Touring, Panoz Racing School cars, IMSA Lights, and the Porsche GT3 series. Each series had multiple practice and qualifying sessions and races spread over the four days.

One of the Atlanta Porsche dealers sponsored the Porscheplatz, and Porsche drivers could participate in several touring laps of the track. Benson and Grace Miller attended as spectators, and in fact the only time I saw them was during their track tour. Attendance this year was over 90,000, probably the largest sports audience in Georgia since the Atlanta Olympics.

Penske's DHL RS Spyders finished 1st & 2nd in class, 5th & 6th overall, 14 laps ahead of the 3rd place car in P2. The Peterson White Lightning Porsche 911 finished 1st in GT2 and 14th overall, two laps ahead of the Ferrari 430 that was their closest competition.

Next year the ALMS is at Mid-Ohio on July 21st, and the Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta is October 6th. I highly recommend either; you'll see me there! Gary

October Social at Xalapa Farm, by Ed Steverson


