

I have very good news, and some bad news. The very good news is the Porsche Paddock smoked our goal of \$3,000 and raised \$4,300+ in the Porsche Paddock (almost twice what we raised last year)!!!!! The bad news is the Corvette Club raised \$149 more than we did and took home the trophy...... they inched us by less than a nose. The British Car Club was third with \$800+ raised, BUT they only had 7 cars show up.... so they won the trophy for most money raised per car. All-in-all the Paddock Challenge raised \$10,600 (beating the goal of \$10k), up from \$6,700 last year....a FABULOUS showing.

Last year the Porsche Paddock raised \$2,250 and beat the Corvette Club by \$112.....so you can see we have quite a tight competition going here.....and the REAL WINNER is the Kentucky Children's Hospital. The Paddock Challenge goal for 2009 is going to be bumped from \$10k to \$15k.

Even though we go nosed out by the Corvette Club in having our name engraved again on the "Becke Cleaver Paddock Challenge Trophy", our Paddock was a resounding success this year....by far the most impressive display of cars in the

Paddock area. It was a great paddock....we had a registration tent, Porsche flags flying high, an a line up "special cars" including an 2004 Carrera GT, 1970 911 RS, 1989 930S, and Brad Smith's Keeneland Concours award winning 356 Cab.....amongst others. Remember....our club had the idea that sparked the beginning of the Keeneland Concours, the Paddock Challenge was Becke Cleavers idea, it was our idea last year that ALL money go to the Kentucky Children's Hospital (and not WUKY radio as well), the Keeneland Concours Committee has more representation from our club than any other. As we look back on the weekend, we can hold our heads high for our accomplishments and influence in this significant event for charity.




