#### Franklin County Humane Society this year's recipient of club's charitable gift drive

In June, the Bluegrass Region PCA Board of Directors chose the Franklin County Humane Society as recipient of the club's annual charitable gift drive.

been delivered to the humane shelter to enable continuing recovery from flood damage that ruined the facility in May.

The Board also chose to pledge a match up to \$500 in the covered bridge charitable event drive to be held later in the year.

These decisions follow through with Board commitment to identify a local beneficiary in addition to our traditional support of the Keeneland Concours d'Elegance Paddock Challenge effort to benefit the University of Kentucky Children's Hospital.

To this end earlier in the year, the Board created a Charitable Committee. I was asked by President Paul Elwyn to chair the committee. Larry Woods An advance gift of \$1,000 has and Chuck Glover volunteered to serve.

> Our initial objective was to recommend local organizations that the Board would consider to be the 2010 beneficiary of our annual Bluegrass Region charitable event.

Each of the committee members chose one charity and presented at the June board meeting. On written ballots the Board chose the Franklin County Humane Society as our 2010 recipient, the agency advocated by Chuck Glover.

On May 4th the Kentucky River crested at 42.6', over 10' above flood stage. The Humane Society is located directly behind the Kentucky River, lock number 4. All animals had to be Franklin County Humane Socievacuated and shelter facilities were flooded.

This unfortunate event created an easy vote for our Board. The humane shelter is local and in need of a lot of assistance to get the operations back to normal.

Due to the urgency, the Board voted to not wait until our charity event in the fall, but to ad-

vance \$1,000 to the Humane Society now when they need it the most.

More money will be collected in the fall at the Eastern Kentucky Drive event hosted by the Womacks.

We hope to have strong attendance by generous club members to provide more funds for the shelter. The club will match up to \$500.00 more dollars of donations in the fall.

This will be the third year for the covered bridge drive, and it is awesome! You don't want to miss it! There will be more information as the time draws near. I am also the chair for the drive, so any questions can be sent my way via email: ed@abracadabragraphics.us.

In addition to the humane society gift, we also will continue to support the Paddock Challenge at the Keeneland Concours. See Page six in this issue of Rumble regarding this project.

The Board also is considering helping at Christmas with a needy child.

The committee has structured the selection process for future beneficiaries. Each year at the February board meeting members will be encouraged to present deserving charities and the Board will vote in March for that year's charity.

As chair of the committee, I felt it would be appropriate to select a new charity each year, as you never know what may happen year to year and who is in the most need at that time. The 2010 flooding of the ety is a prime example.

I have also registered at Make A Wish Foundation in case there is ever a wish including Porsche and or sports cars.



Twenty people gathered at the home of Robert and Denise McClelland for the June 20th Membership Meeting, a potluck dinner.



#### Barber Motorsports Park

## Driving a mile from the sun



How many Porsches do you see waiting for track time?

In June, Bluegrass PCA members Gary Hackney and I joined the Alabama Region for a track weekend at Barber Motorsports Park (Barber) just outside of Birmingham, Alabama.

Barber opened in 2003 and is a 2.38 mile layout with 17 turns and a lot of elevation change. It also has a motorcycle/car museum on the property. I'm told that more money was spent on the development of this facility than any other in the country.

Gary had been to drive this track several times, but it was my first time to drive it. It did-





n't take long to figure out where the money went. When I drove into the facility for the first time it was a little hard to believe. It more closely resembles driving into a really high end golf resort than it does a road course.

Having driven about a dozen tracks myself, the facilities at Barber are second to none that I have seen. They make the fine facilities at Mid-Ohio. VIR and Road Atlanta look very inferior. things and get accustomed to If you have any doubts, just check out the fleet of cars they use for their driving schools....just a few dozen late model Porsche's of all types.

#### Touring the track

The Alabama PCA ran a very nice event. On Saturday morning they did a "tour of the track" at low speed for all the beginners and those that had not been on the track before.

Since I run in a solo group, I asked Gary to ride with me on the tour of the track and give me some tips on the lines. It didn't take long to get a feel for the many blind crests and elevation changes.

Gary's tips allowed me to go much faster much more quickly than if I had to figure everything out for myself. The track has four short passing zones for the non group 5 drivers which is nice so that you never really

have to wait too long to pass someone. The many corners, short straights, and elevation changes on this track make it more of a "technical track" than a "power track" in my opinion.

#### The weather

The weather was... well...hot, I mean really hot. By noon on Saturday I was convinced Birmingham, Alabama was only about a mile from the surface of the sun. I brought a fan and tent along for the paddock which was great, but Barber has a pretty massive tower that is air conditioned so most people spent their between session time inside.

Little did I know I should not have been complaining about

I was told the museum was started using Mr. Barber's personal motorcycle collection and has grown from there. If you are into motorcycles, you really must visit the museum as I've never seen a collection anything like this one before.

Besides the motorcycles they had a few cars, mostly Lotus, but very few Porsches. They did have a 914, 928 & original 550 on the lower level, but they weren't allowing access to that level when I was there.

If you've never run Barber before, you owe it to yourself to make the drive down. The Alabama PCA holds two events there annually and provides a couple of the very few opportunities to drive the track. I hope to get back down there next year.





the heat as Saturday afternoon the skies opened up and a pretty good set of thunderstorms rolled through.

The storms did lower the temperatures nicely, but put a real damper on the afternoon sessions on Saturday. All of the afternoon sessions were run on a really wet surface or semi-wet surface. The weather cleared

up on Sunday and all the sessions were run on dry pavement.

#### The museum

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#### **June 13 Ault Park Concours:**

## A study in contrasts!





Ken Hold's Cayenne Turbo S and Robert McClelland's 356C present study in contrasts.

The Porsche truck at 6,000 pounds and 521 hp dwarfed the 2,400-pound 75 hp 356C, but the 356C had no trouble keeping up on the drive while getting 32 mpg in contrast to the Cayenne's 17 mpg.

It was a study in contrasts! 7:30 a.m. on Sunday morning, June 13 found me alone in the Georgetown Wal-mart parking lot.

Needless to say I was dozing a bit, awaiting the horde of Porsches that would accompany me to the Ault Park Concours. As I looked to the east, I was nearly blinded by a bright yellow object rising from the horizon. No, it was not the rising sun, it was Robert McClelland in his speed yellow 1964 speed yellow 356C. When Robert parked beside my Cayenne TurboS we could not help but compare the two Porsches.

Despite the age difference of 42 years both vehicles had approximately 45,000 miles on their odometers. That's about where the similarity ends. The Porsche truck (SUV) at 6,000 lbs. and 521 hp significantly dwarfed the 2,400 lb. 75 hp 356C.

We later found that on the interstate at 70 mph the 356C

had no problem keeping up and getting 32 mpg while the Cayenne was barely getting 17 mpg.

I'm sure several of our fellow interstate travelers compared the two very different Porsches as we drove north.

Well, it was a very small group driving to Ault Park. I guess I can call two vehicles a group. After all, we had a designated lead vehicle (Cayenne) and a sweep vehicle (356C). And, we both had 2-way radios!

When we arrived at Ault we found that the Ohio Valley Region had made its usual hospitable arrangements for preferred parking for us (both). The folks from Porsche of the Village had their tent located next to the OVR tent near the main entrance. It was great to renew old acquaintances with several members of OVR and share Porsche tails. We were made most welcome.

In addition to our friends from Porsche of the Village and OVR, we saw quite a few Lexington folks. Bluegrass Region members Tom and Connie Jones were there exhibiting a car. Phillip Doty was there judging a class. We also saw several members of the Keeneland Concours comparing vehicles on display.

This year Ault featured a special display of hotrods and beach cars. Two very popular vehicles were the 1930 Ford Woody Station Wagon and the 1967 Amphicar.

There were several excellent presentations of our favorite marque. At the entrance to the show we saw a very distinctive Carrera GT. A fine presentation of the black and orange 1974 Bumble Bee 914 was shown. There were only 500 of these special edition 914's produced. 


